

A. OUT-OF-BOUNDS

- The out-of-bounds is defined by stakes or white lines or by green fences and stone walls.
- When defined by green fences (5/14, 6/15) a ball is out of bounds when it is beyond the wall or fence at ground level (excluding angled supports).
- **B.** Red penalty areas are defined by stakes or red lines and stone walls. When defined by a stone wall a ball is in the red penalty area when it is beyond the stone wall. Rule 17, 1.
- **C.** Ground under repair (GUR) defined by blue lines or stakes. Player must take relief under rule 16, 1.
- **D.** All roads and paths are immovable obstructions relief may be taken under rule 16.1f.
- **E.** If it is known or virtually certain that a player's ball hit a power line the player must replay the stroke by playing the original ball or another ball from the spot where that stroke was made rule 14,6.
- **F.** Preferred Lie: When any part of a player's ball touches part of the general area cut off at fairway height, the player may take relief without penalty only once by choosing a spot to place the ball within 15 cm from the reference point, not closer to the hole,
- **G.** If a ball comes to rest against the fence behind the green of hole 4/13 a player may either:
 - Take stroke-and-distance relief under Rule 17.1d(1), adding one stroke penalty,
 - Or as an additional option the player may take relief by dropping a ball in the Dropping Zone and playing it from the DZ, adding one stroke penalty.
